Dear Ms. Shore:

**RE: College of Nurses of Ontario v. Ruth Doerksen and Ana Galilea Soriano**

I am independent legal counsel to the Discipline Committee of the College of Nurses and have your letter of December 5, 2001, and your more recent letter of January 28, 2002, to Ms. Prudence Morton.

In order for us to proceed with your motion, ordinarily we would receive from you a Notice of Motion and supporting documentation. In the circumstances, presuming that your letter of December 5, 2001 sets out precisely the documents that you are requesting, and that there is nothing further that you wish to rely upon in support of your request for copies of the exhibits, I propose that the Discipline panel treat your correspondence as a formal motion. Once I receive confirmation from you that I have all of the material that you wish to rely upon, counsel for the College and counsel for the Members will be permitted an opportunity to respond by filing material. You will then have an opportunity to respond to that material by filing further written material.


The Rules for the Discipline Committee provide that, in these circumstances, where an interlocutory motion is brought, one or three members of the Discipline Committee may hear the motion. I propose to advise the Chair of the Discipline panel conducting this hearing that she has jurisdiction to deal with this matter alone or, if she prefers, along with two other members of the panel.

The Rules also provide that, where the parties consent, an interlocutory motion can be brought in writing. In other words, the Discipline panel would rely only on the written material you file, along with the material filed by counsel, to determine whether your request should be granted. Please advise whether you would consent to conducting this motion in writing, in this way. Alternatively, an electronic hearing may be held with the consent of the parties, which would be done by conference call.

I have copied this letter to counsel for the College and counsel for the Members to ascertain their views on the issue of whether or not a written or electronic hearing could be held to deal with this issue. If an attendance before the Discipline panel is required, that will be arranged as soon as possible.
